Background

The *Policy Recommendations for Open Access to Research Data in Europe* (RECODE) project is addressing the drivers and barriers in developing Open Data Access (ODA) in Europe to draft recommendations for policy. The first work-package explores stakeholder values and motivations by undertaking a review of policy and related documents, and by conducting 5 case studies that seek to understand ODA in research practice. The case studies are: particle physics; social and clinical research; bioengineering; environmental research; and humanities research.

Aim of the workshop

The aim of the workshop is twofold, it will:

- Present key findings from a review of policy and related documents about Open Access and findings from 5 case studies of research practice.
- Discuss the findings with stakeholders to assess their significance for policy development and for research practice
